These are the same skills I need on the road everyday.

I also enjoy learning lessons from watching other people's mistakes (hopefully without damage or injury). Here are few of my favorites that more drivers than ever should take to heart. A four wheel drive vehicle sliding on four wheels will slide just as far as a two wheel drive vehicle. A four wheel drive vehicle does not brake better than a two wheel drive vehicle. If you start sliding, look where you want to go not at the object you want to avoid – you will go where you are looking. Well, within reason anyway.

At the same time I was writing down the info about Charlie’s car I was grieving the recent diagnosis about the cracked head on my ratted out 86’ 325 with 272,000 miles. Fun Rally in VA Beach March 29, 2003

We will hold a fun rally on Saturday March 29, 2003 starting at 10:00 a.m. sharp at Mount Trashmore. We will finish driving by noon and have lunch at a fun location in Virginia Beach. There is a rest stop midway through the route. The rally will take you through some surprisingly curvy roads in Virginia Beach. The event is free. You pay for your own lunch. Contact Bob Eveleigh at 491-0955 or cheshire@pinn.net if you plan to attend. We need to prepare the right number of event packages and provide a lunch count to the restaurant in advance.

If you have participated in one of our Smithfield rallyes the format for this event is similar. If you have never done a rally before they are fun and not difficult. Here is some more information:

What is a rally? It is a fun drive through the countryside with a set starting point, set route and set destination. The route is known only to the event organizer. As a participant you need to follow a set of directions given to you the morning of the event. These directions will lead you to the destination point for lunch.

How much time do I have to complete the route? As much as you need but lunch will start at a specific time and it is ok to give up and head to the restaurant when lunch time gets near. By the way, the event is planned so you can follow the posted speed limit and finish in time for lunch. In fact, we want you to follow all traffic signs and laws of Virginia. This is a fun event not a timed event.

What if I get hopelessly lost? This may happen so you will be given a 'bail out' package at the beginning of the event. The bail out package contains a map with the route to follow and information on the restaurant. You will also have the organizer's cell phone number in case you have an emergency or need to drop out of the event for any reason (although we expect to end up with the same number of people as we start with).

What else do I need to know about the event? You need a navigator. If you don't have a navigator then post a message on our Das Kummel Yahoo Group telling everyone you need a navigator. You will probably find a volunteer. The driver drives and keeps track of the mileage traveled while the navigator calls out the directions and looks for answers to the clues.

What clues? Oh, I forget to mention the clues. On the instruction sheet there will be clues and questions asked along certain points on the route. You must read the clue

and find the answer to the question. At the end of the route you will turn in your directions with the total number of miles you traveled and your answers to the questions. The team with the lowest miles traveled wins a prize. So does the person with the most questions answered correctly. Ties are resolved by the event organizer.

Is there anything else? Gas tank mostly full, a bottle of water, cell phone and pocket change are all good things to have on hand. Also make sure your car is in roadworthy condition as always.

Personal Delivery of My Z4

I arrived in Spartanburg late at night from Norfolk. It was a pleasure having been met at the airport, by a driver from the BMW delivery center. The next morning myself and 2 other couples drove the demo Z4s on the test track. What a feeling to be able to drive uninhibited, taking the car thru obstacles, wet conditions, etc.! The instructor taught both in a classroom environment and on the track, showing us "professional" driving techniques as well as what the Z4 can do.

Now to the car itself. I am not a sophisticated BMW car person, but I have owned a 325i, and the Z3. The differences in the new car are amazing. The handling is far more solid than the Z3. The sports package really changes the "feel" of the car and the responsiveness of the engine. Great pickup, the car really gets up and goes! The sound system is super, and the gauges and brushed aluminum interior gets comments from anyone who gets in my car. I cannot tell you the pleasure it is to open and close the automatic rag top! If there is one option that one must get its that top...its smooth, and fast. The cupholders even work! They are hidden until needed, and adjust to almost any size cup.

I have to issues with the Z4. One is the placement of the automatic windows...a little tough to get to, especially when the coffee mug is in place. The other is while the car is dry, (even with the topdown!) when the window is open, water just drips onto the inside door panel. I keep a small rag to dry up the car, when it rains.

In closing, suffice it to say that I love my Z4, and recommend it to anyone!!

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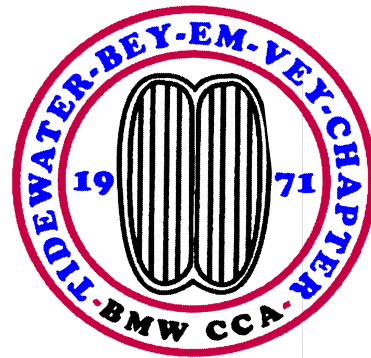
